Dodge City Creates Community Funding Opportunity from Wastewater

Biogas delivers big for the City of Dodge City. The revenue from the Wastewater Treatment Plant Biogas Facility pays for city operations and bond interest and is funding capital improvements without tax hikes.

Without this income, Dodge City would have to raise property taxes by 18% or cut improvement spending!



The project, which is currently undergoing a **\$60 million expansion** to accommodate future growth, produces **pipeline-quality renewable natural gas (RNG)** from the WWTP and captures and treats biogas from a nearby industrial facility's wastewater – providing reciprocal value to another local business. Buyers looking to procure the RNG are sourced by knowledgeable consultants and brought to the city.
